Uvod

Nedelja privatnosti je godišnji događaj koji se održava tokom poslednje nedelje januara u Beogradu, povodom obeležavanja Dana zaštite podataka o ličnosti (28. januara). Nedelja privatnosti prvi put je održana 2021. godine, 10 godina nakon što su Partneri Srbija, zajedno sa Poverenikom za informacije od javnog značaja i zaštitu podataka o ličnosti, prvi put u Srbiji obeležili Dan zaštite podataka o ličnosti.

Nedelja privatnosti stavlja u fokus pitanja privatnosti i zaštite podataka o ličnosti, kroz diskusiju sa stručnjacima iz civilnog, privatnog i javnog sektora. Događaj se organizuje kako bi se unapredilo razumevanje javnosti o izazovima u oblasti zaštite prava na privatnost i stvorio prostor za diskusiju o unapređenju zaštite prava na privatnost građana.

Cilj Nedelje privatnosti je da pruži pregled dostignutih standarda u oblasti privatnosti i zaštite podataka o ličnosti, problema u primeni postojećeg pravnog okvira, kao i da predloži rešenja koja mogu pomoći da se unapredi trenutno stanje u ovoj oblasti. Nedelja privatnosti svake godine u fokus stavlja upotrebu novih tehnologija i međunarodne trendove koji imaju uticaj na ostvarivanje i zaštitu prava na privatnost.

Nedelja privatnosti 2024 održava se od 24. do 26. januara 2024. godine.

Kroz seriju panela, okruglih stolova, radionica i prezentacija, stvaramo prostor u kome predstavnici javnog, civilnog i privatnog sektora, kao i šira javnost, mogu da razgovaraju, povećaju međusobno razumevanje i iniciraju promene u oblasti zaštite privatnosti.

Introduction

Privacy Week is an annual event held during the last week of January in Belgrade, Serbia, in order to mark the Data Protection Day (28 January). It was established in 2021, 10 years after Partners Serbia, together with the Commissioner for Access to Information of Public Importance and Personal Data Protection, marked the Data Protection Day for the first time in Serbia. The event centers around discussions on privacy and data protection issues with experts from the civil, private, and the public sector.

The event is organized to increase the public's understanding of the variety of issues facing citizens' right to privacy, how to defend citizens' right to privacy, and larger discussions about the state of privacy protection within Serbia and globally. Privacy Week gives public officials, civil society, the private sector, and the public space to discuss, increase mutual understanding, and initiate change.

The aim of Privacy Week is to provide an overview of the achieved standards and problems in the implementation of the existing privacy and personal data protection legal framework, as well as to propose solutions that can help improve the current state of affairs in this area. Every year, Privacy Week focuses on the use of new technologies and international trends that have an impact on the exercise and protection of the right to privacy.

Privacy Week 2024 takes place from 24 to 26 January, 2024. Through a series of panels, round tables, workshops and presentations, we create a space where representatives of the public, civil, and private sector, as well as the interested public can talk, increase mutual understanding, and initiate changes in the field of privacy protection.

I panel: Izaberi privatnost - uloga ličnih podataka u globalnoj izbornoj godini

U toku 2024. godine više od polovine građana na svetu imaće pravo da glasa. U doba digitalizacije i procvata društvenih mreža izborna prava i pravo na privatnost građana značajno su ugroženi. Demokratije počivaju na sposobnosti sprovođenja fer izbora, slobodnih od bilo kakvog oblika mešanja ili uticaja. Društvene mreže se u svetu godinama koriste da utiču na volju birača. U Srbiji su u decembru 2023. održani izbori, tokom kojih je zabeležen veliki broj nepravilnosti i zloupotreba prava građana. Panel "Izaberi privatnost" fokusiraće se na zloupotrebu ličnih podataka građana u izbornim procesima. Tokom panela razgovaraće-mo o izazovima u oblasti zaštite ličnih podataka, dezinformacijama i uticaju velikih platforma i društvenih mreža na volju birača, pravnom okviru EU i efektima EU propisa na Srbiju i druge zemlje regiona, i drugim temama od značaja za zaštitu privatnosti građana i zaštitu izbornih prava. Panelisti će biti stručnjaci iz oblasti izbornog zakonodavstva, zaštite ličnih podataka, zaštite digitalnih prava i drugi.

Panel I: Privacy – Role of Personal Data in the Global Election Year

The election process stands threatened by social media manipulation. In the area of digital platforms, the freedom of choice and the right to privacy are vastly endangered. Democracies are postulated upon their ability to carry out fair elections, free from any form of interference or manipulation. Social media has been reportedly used to distort public opinion nearing election events in the United States and beyond. During 2024, more than half of the world's population will have the opportunity to vote in different elections. In Serbia, elections were held in December of 2023 with many irregularities and abuses of citizens' rights. The panel, "Choose Privacy" will be focused on the use of personal data for political campaign purposes. The panel will explore how disinformation is spread online during election campaigns and how the misuse of citizens' personal data can change or influence their political decisions. Panelists will be experts in the fields of combating online disinformation, protecting digital rights, privacy data protection, and others.

Kristina Obrenović je diplomirana pravnica. Pridružila se Partnerima Srbija u julu 2017. godine, i od tada radi na različitim projektima u oblastima vladavine prava, transparentnosti, dobrog upravljanja, borbe protiv korupcije, privatnosti i zaštite podataka o ličnosti. Trenutno radi kao koordinatorka projekata i istraživačica. Kristina je autorka više publikacija i članaka koji se odnose na pravosuđe, transparentnost, dobro upravljanje, borbu protiv korupcije, zaštitu podataka o ličnosti i zaštitu ljudskih prava. Kristina je članica Radne grupe za izradu Akcionog plana za implementaciju Inicijative Partnerstvo za otvorenu upravu i članica Radne grupe Nacionalnog konventa EU za Po-glavlje 23.

Đorđe Bojović je savetnik za spoljnu politiku grupe Zeleni/EFA u Evropskom parlamentu, sa fokusom na Zapadni Balkan i proširenje EU. Stručnjak je za pravo EU i studirao je na Evropskom koledžu u Brižu i na Fakultetu za ekonomiju i političke nauke Univerziteta u Londonu (LSE). She joined Partners Serbia in July 2017, where she has been working on various projects in the fields of rule of law, transparency, good governance, anti-corruption, privacy, and personal data protection. Currently, she works as a Project Coordinator and Senior Researcher. Kristina is the author of several publications and articles related to the judiciary, transparency, good governance, anti-corruption, personal data protection, and the protection of human rights. Kristina is a member of the Working Group for drafting the Action Plan for the Implementation of the Initiative Open Government Partnership, and a member of the Working group of the EU National Convent for Chapter 23.

Đorđe Bojović is Foreign Policy Advisor for the Greens/EFA group in the European Parliament, focusing on the Western Balkans and EU Enlargement. He is an EU law scholar who has studied at the College of Europe in Bruges and at the London School of Economics and Political Sciences (LSE). Prior to his work in the European Parliament, Mr. Bojović has been active in the civil society sector in the Western Balkans region dealing with the Serbia-Kosovo normalisation of relations, EU integrations of the Western Balkans, fundamental and human rights, and regional co-operation.

Tijana Cvjetićanin is the co-creator of two fact-checking platforms in Bosnia and Herzegovina: Istinomjer (2010) and Raskrinkavanje (2017). She is active in various fact-checking networks and initiatives such as the International Fact-Checking Network (IFCN) where she is a member of the Advisory board; regional fact-checking network SEE Check and the Euro-

Goran Rizaov vodi program Mediji za demokratiju u Fondaciji Metamorphosis. Novinar je sa više od 15 godina iskustva. Vodi obuke o novinarstvu zasnovanom na organizovanim podacima, pozitivnim narativima i borbi protiv dezinformacija. Diplomirao je novinarstvo na Univerzitetu "sv. Ćirilo i Metodije" u Skoplju. Goran je dobitnik nagrade „Nikola Mladenov“ za istraživačko novinarstvo za 2015. godinu u Severnoj Makedoniji.

Goran Rizaov leads the Media for Democracy program at Metamorphosis Foundation. He is a journalist with more than 15 years of experience. He does trainings on data journalism, positive narratives and combatting disinformation. He holds a bachelor degree in journalism from the Cyril and Methodius University in Skopje. Goran was awarded the investigative journalism award "Nikola Mladenov" for 2015 in North Macedonia.

Montserrat Legorreta is the Program and Operations Associate at the Global Network Initiative (GNI) – a nonprofit organization with a mission to protect and advance freedom of expression and privacy rights in the information and communications technology (ICT) sector by setting a global standard for responsible decision making. She im-

II panel: Cena privatnosti

Mediji sve agresivnije zadiru u privatnost građana, objavljuvajući ličnih podataka kada za to nema javnog interesa. Posledice ovako teških povreda novinarske etike, posebno kada se dešavaju u onlajn sferi, su akutne i dugotrajne. Slučaj dva masovna ubistva, u osnovnoj školi Vladislav Ribnikar i u okolini Mladenovca, najdrastičnije svedoče o ovom negativnom trendu, a izveštavanje medija u nedeljama nakon masovnih ubistava bilo je predmet detaljne analize čije će rezultate predstaviti na panelu. Stalni medijski monitoring BIRN-a zabeležio je i pogoršanje negativnih trendova koji se iz godine u godinu ponavljaju, uključujući instrumentalizaciju medija zarad političkih ili drugih interesa i curenje informacija iz institucija. Koja su još drastična kršenja zabeležena, koje su posledice ovakvog izveštavanja po kvalitetu informisanja, da li je kršenje privatnosti podstaknuto klikovima i digitalnim okruženjem, pitanja su za diskusiju na ovom panelu.

Dragana Obradović je direktorka Balkanske istraživačke mreže u Srbiji (BIRN Srbija), medijske organizacije koja okuplja vodeće istraživačke novinare, i istraživače u oblasti razvoja medijskog sektora. Tokom njenog mandata, BIRN je postao prepoznatljiv po profesionalizmu i uticaju u oblasti razvoja medija i vladavine prava. Redak-

Panel II – The Price of Privacy

The media is increasingly endangering the citizens' privacy by publishing personal data when there is no public interest in doing so. The consequences of such serious violations of journalistic ethics, especially when they occur in the online sphere, are acute and long-lasting. The case of two mass shootings, in the elementary school Vladislav Ribnikar and in the vicinity of Mladenovac, are the most drastic examples of this negative trend. The media coverage on Sunday after the mass murders was the subject of a detailed analysis, the results of which we will present on the panel. BIRN's constant media monitoring has also recorded the worsening of negative trends that are repeated year after year, including the instrumentalization of the media for political or other interests and the leaking of information from institutions. Some of the questions to be discussed on this panel will include, what other drastic violations have been noticed, what are the consequences of such reporting on the quality of media information, whether the violation of privacy is encouraged by clicks and the digital environment, and more.

Dr Aleksandra Krstić je vanredna profesorka na Odeljenju za novinarstvo i komunikologiju Fakulteta političkih nauka Univerziteta u Beogradu. Oblast njenog interesovanja su studije medija i novinarstva, vizuelnog komuniciranja, medijske etike, demokratizacije medija, medijske reprezentacije, odnosa politike i medija. Rukovodi Centrom za medije i medijska istraživanja na FPN. Objavila je desetine naučnih i stručnih radova u nacionalnim i međunarodnim časopisima, među kojima su i European Journal of Communication, European Journal of Cultural Studies, Journalism, Problems of Post-Communism, Media, War and Conflict, Europe-Asia Studies. Članica je Upravnog odbora EU COST akcije „OPINION“, ekspertkinja na brojnim domaćim i međunarodnim naučno-istraživačkim projektima, rukovoditeljka stručnih projekata kojima se

Dragana Obradović is the Balkan Investigative Reporting Network country director for Serbia (BIRN Serbia), a media organization that brings together leading investigative reporters and researchers in the field of media sector development. During her term, BIRN became recognizable for its professionalism and influence in the field of media development and rule of law. BIRN has won numerous national and international journalism awards.

Tanja Maksić, program coordinator, has been a member of the BIRN Serbia team since 2010. She designs and heads media policy and good governance projects. Tanja also conducts BIRN research, is in charge of identifying topics and methodologies of research, writing policy reports and recommendations, as well as devising further public advocacy actions. Although she studied journalism, Tanja specialized in media monitoring as early as during her studies, especially in content analysis of media production and media economics. She is particularly involved in advocating for transparent budget financing of the media. Tanja graduated from the Faculty of Political Sciences in Belgrade, and before BIRN, she had worked for the Association of Independent Electronic Media (ANEM) and was an associate of the Belgrade Media Center.

Dr. Aleksandra Krstić is an associate professor at the Department of Journalism and Communication at the Faculty of Political Sciences of the Belgrade University. Her areas of interest are the studies of media and journalism, visual communication, media ethics, media democratization, media representation and relationship between politics and the media. She heads the Center for Media and Media Research at the Faculty of

Bila je voditeljka TV emisije Tabu (Insajder TV), gde je obrađivala teme vezane za traumu, kao što su seksualna trgovina, zlostavljanje starijih osoba, problemi mentalnog zdravlja itd. Suosnivač je grupe "Novinarke protiv nasilja nad ženama", koautor Smernica za etičko izveštavanje o rodno zasnovanom nasilju, Priručnika za medijsku pismenost za školske nastavnike i Smernica za ministarstva unutrašnjih poslova zemalja zapadnog Balkana o izveštavanju o rodno zasnovanom nasilju, počinjenom uz upotrebu malokalibarskog i lakog naoružanja. She was the host of TV show Tabu (Insajder TV), where she covered topics related to trauma, such as sex trafficking, abuse of the elderly, mental health issues, etc. She is a co-founder of the group „Female journalists against violence towards women“, co-author of the Guidelines for ethical reporting on gender-based violence, Media literacy manual for school teachers, and

Presentation: Cyber attack on critical information infrastructures as a form of personal data breach – the case of the Electric Power Industry of Serbia (EPS)

Facilitators: **dr Milana Pisarić**, Ph.D., Assistant Professor, Faculty of Law, University of Novi Sad , **Ivan Marković**, IT Expert and Hacker

This case study will analyze, based on available information, the technical side of the recent cyber attack on EPS as a critical information infrastructure of the Republic of Serbia. The steps of competent institutions will be considered in the reaction to the endangerment of this information system of particular importance, both in terms of the national regulation on information security and personal data protection, the provisions of criminal law, as well as internationally recognized standards of good practice.

Milana Pisarić is an assistant professor at the Faculty of Law of the University of Novi Sad. In 2007, she graduated from the Faculty of Law in Novi Sad, where in 2010 she defended her master's thesis on inadmissible evidence in criminal proceedings. In 2016, she defended her doctoral dissertation on the specifics of proving cyber-crime at the University of Belgrade Faculty of Law. At the Faculty of Law in Novi Sad, she was elected to the narrow research field of criminal law as a teaching assistant in 2008, as an assistant in 2010, as a teaching assistant with PhD in 2017, as an assistant professor in 2023. She held exercises within the courses Technique and Tactics of Criminalistics, Methodology of Criminalistics, Criminal Procedure Law 1 and Criminal Procedure Law 2 and Special Investigative Techniques. She is interested in the following research fields: criminal procedure, (inadmissible) evidence, electron-

Odluka tužilaštva da odbaci krivičnu prijavu u slučaju deljenja eksplisitnih fotografija i snimaka na Telegram grupi "Nišlike", aktualizovala je pitanje procesuiranja osvetničke pornografije. Novinarka koja je istraživala ovaj fenomen u Srbiji i mapirala još 16 Telegram grupe koje bez pristanka dele eksplisitni seksualni sadržaj, Andjela Milivojević, podeliće svoja iskustva i savete za rad na ovoj osetljivoj temi. U nastavku panela razgovaraćemo o posledicama osvetničke pornografije, stigmatizaciji žrtava, mogućnosti da se ovakav sadržaj ukloni sa interneta i da se počinioци procesuiraju, sistematskom neuspehu da se žrtve zaštite i potencijalnim rešenjima, kao i o iskustvima zemalja u regionu koje su uspele da kriminalizuju osvetničku pornografiju.

Andjela Milivojević je višestruko nagrađivana istraživačka novinara iz Beograda. Andjela je bila deo tima Centru za istraživačko novinarstvo Srbije - CINS, a danas radi za BBC World Service, a sarađuje sa više medija iz Srbije i regiona. Od 2011. godine piše o korupciji i kriminalu u Srbiji i na Balkanu, izveštavala je o korupciji u visokoškolskom obrazovanju, zloupotrebama u privatizaciji i javnim nabavkama, imovini funkcionera. Panel II: Image-based sexual abuse: Using technology to Impede Female Privacy and Consent

The prosecutor's office's decision to dismiss the criminal complaint in the case of sharing explicit photos and videos in the Telegram group "Nišlike" brought up the issue of processing revenge pornography. A journalist who investigated this phenomenon in Serbia and mapped 16 other Telegram groups that share explicit sexual content without consent, Andjela Milivojević, will share her experiences and tips for working on this sensitive topic. During the panel, we will also discuss the consequences of revenge pornography, the stigmatization of victims, the possibility of removing such content from the internet and prosecuting the perpetrators, the systematic failure to protect victims, potential solutions, and the experiences of countries in the region that have succeeded in criminalizing revenge pornography.

Andjela Milivojević is an investigative journalist from Belgrade and a recipient of multiple awards. Andjela was a member of the Center for Investigative Journalism of Serbia – CINS team, and she now works for the BBC World Service and cooperates with several media from Serbia and the region. Since 2011, she has been writing about corruption and crime in Serbia and the Balkans, reporting on corruption in higher education, pri-

Različite vrste tehnologija i alata za nadzor postale su lako dostupne vladama, ali i pojedincima širom sveta. Novinari, aktivisti, politički akteri i drugi širom sveta bili su subjekti nadzora i u autokratskim i u demokratskim društвима, a ostaje pitanje da li su tehnologije digitalnog nadzora postale sastavni deo modernog upravljanja?

Fokus ovog panela biće na savremenim oblicima digitalnog nadzora, kao što su video nadzor sa biometrijskim prepoznavanjem lica, alati za praćenje aktivnosti građana prilikom korišćenja interneta, AI vođena analitika obrade podataka, softveri za prikupljanje podataka sa mobilnih telefona i računara građana i drugi. Panel I: Future of digital surveillance

Different types of surveillance equipment and tools have become easily accessible to governments and to individuals throughout the world. Journalists, activists, and political figures have been subject to surveillance in both autocratic and democratic societies. The question remains whether the digital surveillance technologies have become an integral part of modern governing. Therefore, the focus of this panel will be on modern forms of digital surveillance, such as video surveillance with biometric facial recognition, software for extracting data from mobile phones and computers of citizens, tools for monitoring the activities of citizens when using the internet, AI-driven data analytics, etc, and their impact on privacy. Panellists will discuss the legality, the ethics of using these systems, and their impact on the rights and freedoms of citizens.

Uroš Mišljenović has been working at Partners Serbia since 2011. As the program manager on privacy, good governance and civil society development, Uroš has developed and conducted a series of studies on the implementation of the legal framework on personal data protection in Serbia and held several trainings for representatives of the public, civil and private sectors in this

Nakon početne globalne pompe oko ChatGPT-a i celokupnog pojma generativne veštačke inteligencije, pojavila su se različita pitanja vezana za zakonitost i etičnost ovih modela. Jedno od ključnih pitanja odnosi se na zakonitost obrade ličnih podataka koji se koriste za obuku ovih modela, posebno kada sadrže osjetljive podatke građana. Ovim problemom bavila se italijanska agencija za zaštitu ličnih podataka (Garante) koja je u martu 2023. ograničila obradu ličnih podataka italijanskih građana od strane OpenAI. Panel će se baviti pitanjima privatnosti vezanim za razvoj i upotrebu generativnih AI modela. Posebno će se istražiti da li je bitka za privatnost već izgubljena široko rasprostranjenom upotreboru veštačke inteligencije i da li postoji prostor da se uvede ravnoteža između zakonitosti, etike i morala u razvoju ovih modela, bez sprečavanja daljeg tehnološkog razvoja i inovacija.

Panel II: Protection of Privacy in Generative AI – where innovation meets law, ethics and morality

Following the initial global hype over ChatGPT and the overall notion of generative AI, various issues related to the legality and ethics of these models arose. One of the key questions is related to the legality of processing of personal data used to train these models, especially when they contain sensitive data of individuals. The questions were, at least temporarily, addressed by the Italian Data Protection Authority (the Guarantee) that in March 2023 limited the processing of personal data of Italian citizens by OpenAI. Therefore, this panel will address the privacy concerns related to the development and use of generative AI models. It will specifically explore whether the battle for privacy has already been lost with the widespread use of generative AI and whether there is a space to introduce a balance between legality, ethics, and morality in developing these models without preventing further technological development and innovation.

Predrag Topić (consultant, Head of Business Development, Things Solver) has more than 15 years of relevant business experience. During his career, he focused on the development of business operations, heading different company activities and projects which were at the intersection of

Nevena Ružić has been a long-term consultant on personal data protection, data security and freedom of information and expression in the country and abroad. Since 2022, she has been on the Council of Europe list of experts on personal data protection. For more than 10 years, she has been assistant secretary-general at the Office of the Commissioner for Information of Public Importance and Personal Data Protection, in charge of the harmonization of regulations and practice. She co-authored educational videos Šoljica privatnosti sa Jelenom i Nevenom (A Cup of Privacy with Jelena and Nevena), which are available on YouTube and Vimeo.

Dr. Ann Cavoukian is recognized as one of the world's leading privacy experts. Dr. Cavoukian served an unprecedented three terms as the Information & Privacy Commissioner of Ontario, Canada. There she created Privacy by Design, a framework that seeks to proactively embed privacy into the design specifications of information technologies, networked infrastructure and business practices, thereby achieving the strongest protection possible. In 2010, International Privacy Regulators unanimously passed a Resolution recognizing Privacy by Design as an International Standard. Since then, PbD has been translated into 40 languages! In 2018, PbD was included in a sweeping new law in the EU: the General Data
